CONNECTIONS MADE

- Registered over 300 hundred of newly diagnosed patients.
- Provided one-on-one patient navigation.
- Partnered with the River Valley Food Bank, the Community Services Clearing House, Stu's Clean Cookin and Vesta Valley Farms to provide nutrient-rich food to cancer patients.
- Provided gas vouchers and city transit bus passes for travel to and from treatment; wigs and head coverings; financial assistance for utilities nd prescriptions; medical supplies including mastectomy & ostomy supplies.
- Assisted out-of-town patients with temporary housing options in partnership with The Presbyterian Guest House and Goddard United Methodist Church

- Navigated patients to over \$16,000 in financial aid through outside agencies. (Angel Flight, Cancer Cares, Hearts & Homes, Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, River Valley Ovarian Cancer Society, TAG Grants, etc)
- Facilitated education sessions for the community
- Facilitated weekly support groups led by licensed therapist.
- Facilitated monthly support group meetings for our Kids Kicking Cancer group.
- Partnered with Johnson Dermatology to provide free skin cancer screenings and the Arkansas Prostate Cancer Foundation to provide free prostate cancer screenings.
- Reached thousands of area youth with vital information about sun safety with our Sun SMART Program and Take a Stand, Don't Tan in partnership with the Arkansas Cancer Coalition and River Valley Skin Cancer Alliance.
- Distributed Mary Kay Beauty Kits in partnership with a local Mary Kay Representative.
- Sponsored congratulatory Daisy Bundles to those finishing Radiation Treatments.
